**FOOD PANTRY AT ST. PATRICK'S PARISH IN PELHAM, N.H.,
WINS \$1,500 FROM JEANNE D'ARC CREDIT UNION**

LOWELL – Jeanne D'Arc Credit Union is pleased to announce that the second winner of the “Give a Click” campaign located on our website – *WeShareACommonThread.org* – is the Food Pantry at St. Patrick's Parish in Pelham, N.H., a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing food and household supplies for residents in need of assistance.

Jeanne D'Arc Credit Union understands the value of community and working together. On the *WeShareACommonThread.org* website, community members can read about three worthy nonprofit organizations and then vote for the one they would most like to see us support. The charity with the most votes then receives a \$1,500 donation from the Credit Union. Different charities are posted every quarter, so we encourage people to keep returning to *WeShareACommonThread.org* to help their favorites gain a much-needed donation.

When the second campaign ended, the Food Pantry at St. Patrick's Parish in Pelham, N.H., came in first place with 176 votes, while the Dracut Food Pantry and Chelmsford Community Exchange came in second and third. Individuals are permitted to vote only once.

The current “Give a Click” campaign features three local nonprofits that assist children and teens: My Father's House in Chelmsford, Girls Incorporated of Greater Lowell, and The Paul Center in Chelmsford.
